A sizable proportion of the existing building stock in the EU can fall into the category of historic, heritage and other protected buildings, many of which are amongst the worst-performing buildings in terms of energy consumption.

It is therefore imperative that they must be taken into account in the design of future national buildings renovation plans and policy measures to meet the EU's climate objectives by improving their energy performance and reducing CO2 emissions while also improving living conditions.
